A marine VHF radio is a vital piece of safety equipment aboard a boat; anyone intending to go afloat should know how to operate one correctly. Under international law a boat's radio transmitter can only be operated under the control of someone who has an appropriate radio certificate. A VHF radio certificate is a prerequisite for those undertaking the ISA or RYA Yachtmaster Coastal or Yachtmaster Offshore exam and many yacht charter companies will require someone on board to hold a valid VHF certificate. The Short Range Certificate, (SRC), is currently the appropriate VHF certificate for most small craft users.

Our radio courses cover the use of both fixed and portable hand held VHF radios and include a session dedicated to practical hands on radio operation.
